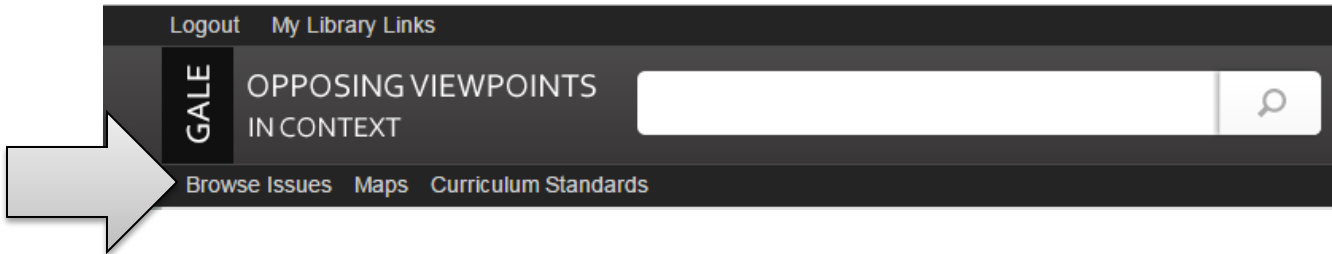

Follow these simple steps to get started on the right track:

1. Click the **Browse Issues** link at the top of the page.



2. Search your topic (Alcoholism, type it into the *Opposing Viewpoints* Search box.).
3. Each topic link will take you to a topic page. The most useful sections of the topic page are these:
  - Main topic article at the top of the page
  - **Viewpoints** (opinion articles)
  - **Magazines** (articles from print magazines)
  - **News** (articles from newspapers)

To see all of the articles, click the **View All** link. Look through all three sections to find a good article or two or all three!
